Anzac Day is this coming Sunday and I am writing to provide an update in relation to the whole-of-government planning and support for Anzac Day 2021.

The current exemption for the CBD March remains at 10,000 participants, with no limit on spectators. Key messages have been distributed to all relevant NSW Government agencies who are in final planning ahead of Sunday's events.

Public messaging will encourage people to attend local events, and to remind the community that only ticket holders are able to attend the Dawn Service at the Cenotaph in Martin Place. Messaging will also emphasise if they are coming into the Sydney CBD as a spectator, that they will need to QR code check in on their arrival at their destination and stay socially distanced. These measures are part of the event's plans to ensure COVID-19 safety.

Given the constantly changing nature of the COVID-19 pandemic, it is important to continually refer to the [NSW Government website](#) for any updates to the current Public Health Order and exemptions.
